To the citizens of Wapakoneta,

Last year the City voted to keep our refuse and recycling services in house as opposed to subbing them out to Wright Refuse. Since then we have purchased a new refuse truck with plans to purchase another within the next year. That will take care of our refuse problems for the most part.

Now we need to address our recycling issues. It is our intention in the near future to purchase what is called a dual stream recycling truck. What that means is that the recycling will be dumped into one of two bins in the truck. One will be used for newspaper and cardboard and the other will be used for tin, aluminum and number one and two plastics, this will require everyone to have two containers. (I use a Wapak recycling bin and a house size waste container for my paper.)

What we will no longer be picking up at the curb is glass. When glass is mixed with our other recyclables and breaks it contaminates the other materials, it is a hazard to the employees picking it up, and it can't be sorted at the Auglaize County Solid Waste District in St. Marys. Add that to the fact that glass has no value, and this is a change that needs to be made. Another benefit of the dual stream truck is that it will do away with curbside sorting of glass, which will speed up the process and hopefully cut down on the injuries to our workers. At this time, we have three employees either off work or on workmans compensation due to injuries from the recycling jobs.

We encourage everyone to keep their glass in a container at home and as needed bring it to our 24/7 recycling containers at our Street Dept. building on Harrison St. by the river.
